Coming from the darkest place where I felt the hopelessness and desperation to end life as I knew it, only to find out that it wasn't until I was at my lowest that I looked for the Most High. Thirty years of being clean and sober, coupled with using my energy to help other women recover and regain HOPE. All that I went through from homelessness, incarceration, and addiction prepared me to help others escape that misery."

FEMI STAFF: How did it feel knowing that Jennifer Hudson and Taraji P. Henson were captivated by your story?

Kim Carter: "Surreal! We often hear about rags to riches, but in my case, it was death to life. After I finally quit pinching myself, I began to have those conversations with Taraji, and I knew she was the REAL DEAL! I knew this movie was going to happen, but didn't know who would play me. Lo and Behold, I'm on Zoom with Taraji and the DIVA, Jennifer Hudson is on there, and she's ecstatic about the script and looking forward to helping the project in any way she could. I'm thinking to myself, 'Thiswoman just played Aretha Franklin, and now she's playing me.' I had the most amazing time on set, revelling in the fact that God was, again, using my mess to send His message. This film, 'Tell It Like A Woman', is an anthology of 7 women's stories from across the globe.
